Additional Information: Applications and Admissions for Fall 2023

- *1 applicant switched from CMHC to SC during the interview process (better fit)
- **There were another 18 who began applications but either withdrew or failed to submit materials
- To keep within CACREP faculty/student ratios we will only be able to admit 12-14 for CMHC next year (Fall 2024) and 10 for SC next year (Fall 2024) unless we secure another faculty line. This will be a reduction of 10 – 12 students for CMHC for fall 2024 and a reduction of 2 for SC.
- SC was only able to accept 10 this past year (Fall 2023) due to practicum/internship supervision requirements. Dr. Upton is currently the only faculty member who can supervise SC students in practicum and internship.

Advisory Board Suggestions for Improvement and Changes Made as a Result

- Dispositions Evaluation: Utilize disposition evaluation format in LiveText as the format is easier to understand
 - Originally set to implement immediately, however, we are likely moving to a new evaluation and data collection system beginning Fall 2024.
 - The disposition evaluation format will be included in the new system
- Specific suggestions for classes:
 - Crises & Trauma: Increase examples, case studies, and application assignments and opportunities. Alumnus who teaches this class at another university will review the syllabus and provide suggestions
 - Feedback from various individuals including students were solicited and will be incorporated
 - School Counseling Advisory Board were pleased that the Crises and Trauma course is now required for SC students
 - Group Counseling: Description of group process standardized across sections and process groups.
 - Process Group Orientation was created and held prior to Process Groups starting in Spring
 - Research: More face-to-face sessions, and incremental assignments that build to final project with samples and examples.
 - 2 face-to-face sessions to be held in Summer 2024
 - Curriculum Action Form will be completed to move the Research class from on-line to blended format to increase face-to-face contact
 - Very positive feedback regarding helping skills.



Advisory Board Suggestions for Improvement and Changes Made as a Result

- Increase feedback from site supervisors during practicum/internship with regard to evaluations.
 - Beginning summer 2024, increase contact with site supervisors by incorporating more site visits, phone contacts, and trainings
- Provide additional supervision training for site supervisors: Training held in Spring 2023 and additional training will be held in Fall 2024




Student and Alumni Suggestions to Improve Program

- Move Motivational Interviewing from Summer to Fall or Spring
 - Set to implement Spring 2025
- Some students enter the program with a background in psychology and feel they have a good basic understanding of research, foundational theories, and concepts
 - Implement the following by Fall 2025
 - Pre-screen students' knowledge after admission/acceptance to program
 - Pre-program advisement meeting for all students
 - If incoming student scores low on content areas, send Theories/Resource Packet and set specific goals for the student to complete before the fall semester begins.
 - Encourage students to purchase the Theories Student Workbook before the semester begins
 - *Theories and Resource Packet- send to all incoming students. Faculty suggested including theories study guides be placed in this packet for students to review prior to the first fall semester in the program.*



Student and Alumni Suggestions to Improve Program

- Application of theories/Theory into practice.
- Students noted they had knowledge of the theories but it was difficult to know how to utilize and implement the theories in practice (implement in Skills and Theories Class by Fall 2025)
 - Increase number of guest speakers
 - Speakers demonstrate theories in practice.
 - Speakers present cases and demonstrate theoretical conceptualization of case.
- Present more cases and utilize a theory to conceptualize it. Ask Guest speakers to process the theory used. (Implement in Theories Class Fall 2024)
- Increase use of videos that utilize specific theoretical orientations.
 - Select specific psychotherapy.net videos and place in CANVAS modules for the week covering the theory. (implement in Theories Class Fall 2024).



Student and Alumni Suggestions to Improve Program

- Research Class:
- Great variability in general knowledge entering the course
- Students would like it to be a Fall or Spring Course due to the amount of material
 - Will spread intervention project across internship to utilize knowledge learned in research class (implement Fall 2024)
 - Change full proposal assignment to -2 page proposal outline and/or Poster Presentation (implement Summer 2024)
 - Make research proposal due in the fall/spring during internship (core faculty and current intern will evaluate feasibility at the end of fall semester 2024)
- Increase discussion videos/mini-lectures
 - Record, label and infuse into course (goal is to implement by Summer 2025)
 - Add multiple access points for students to review/preview. (goal is to implement by Summer 2025)
- Students liked the text
 - especially the companion resources with the text



Student and Alumni Suggestions to Improve Program

- Multicultural Course:
- *Text:* Consider changing text-faculty are reviewing texts and may change text
- *Instruction-* faculty provided with the following feedback:
 - *Increase instructor presentation of materials*
 - Mini-lecture by the instructor before students present on the topic
 - Shorten presentation to allow for instructor facilitation of discussion
 - *Increase guest speakers & panel discussions with counselors from diverse backgrounds*
 - *Immersion experience*
 - *Increase support and structure*
 - *Faculty led a discussion with students about creating structured immersion experiences*
 - *maybe in Louisiana/Mobile*
 - *Students were supportive of this and also recognized there would be costs associated*

Student Demographics

- Diverse
 - In age, race, ethnicity, sexual orientation, disability, religion,
 - 53% of the 2019 Cohort were from diverse backgrounds (Graduated in 2021)
 - 40% of the 2020 Cohort were from diverse backgrounds (Graduated in 2022)
 - 52.9% of the 2021 Cohort are from Diverse Backgrounds (Graduating in 2023)
 - 57.9% of the 2022 Cohort are from Diverse Backgrounds (Graduating in 2024)
 - 50% of the 2023 Cohort are from Diverse Backgrounds (Graduating in 2025)



Changes Made in 2021-2022

- Moved Multicultural Class to Spring Semester: Positive Feedback from students
- Moved Research Class to Summer: Need to re-evaluate structure and assignments based on student feedback
- Increased Frequency of Disposition Evaluations: Implemented
- Split research and career classes into SC and CMHC: Positive Feedback
- Added Canvas Comprehensive Exam Review Site Information
- Hired adjuncts from non-majority backgrounds



Changes: Theories/Helping Relationships (suggestions from advisory board, students, and faculty)

- Increased guest speaker demonstrations of counseling using an applied theory
- Require students to incorporate theory into 3rd and 4th simulated counseling sessions**will implement in Spring 2024
- Add video rooms & Simulation Lab to practice counseling skills (1 room completed another slated for completion in February 2024)
- Increase use of small groups to discuss development of personal theory & personal theory paper. Implemented Fall 2024 (will gradually incorporate into more activities)
- Add didactic theory to practice into practicum class** will implement Summer 2024
 - Case studies conceptualized using a theory
 - Case studies used to for reflection, discussion, and to describe techniques



Suggested Changes: Research

- Add mini video lectures with discussion (currently developing additional mini video lectures)
- Change to a blended course (in progress, hopefully approved by summer 2024)
- Add 4-5 face to face sessions (if blended designation approved)
- Substitute a 1-2 page research proposal outline (initiated Summer 2023; positive feedback)
 - Move research proposal completion to internship (initiated Fall 2023)



Disposition Evaluations

- Add anchoring examples to the Counseling Program Student Disposition Evaluation (in progress)
- Student Self-Evaluations of Dispositions
 - Increase time spent instructing students on dispositions and utilizing the Counseling Program Student Disposition Evaluation (additional time is spent orienting students to counselor dispositions)
- Site Supervisor Evaluations of Student Dispositions
 - Include instructions on completing the Counseling Program Student Disposition Evaluation during site supervisor training (in place for upcoming supervisor training in the Spring)

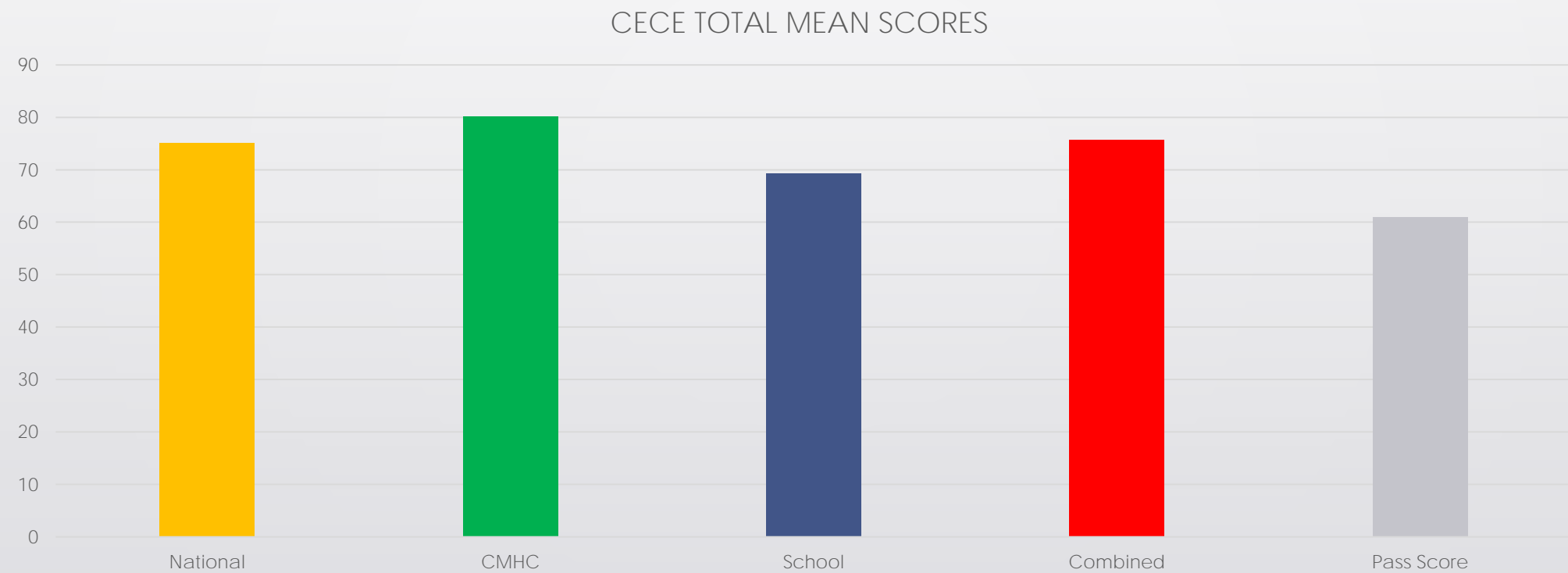

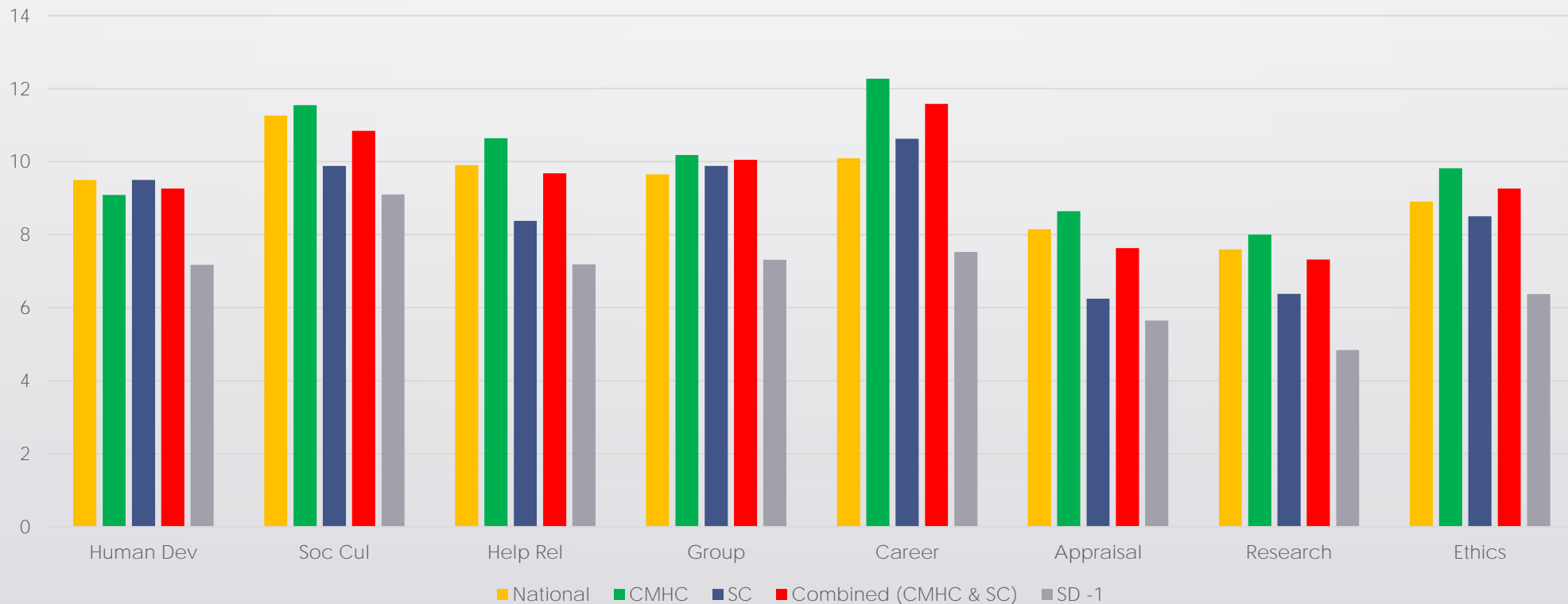

CECE COUNSELING PROGRAM SCORES COMPARED TO NATIONAL MEAN



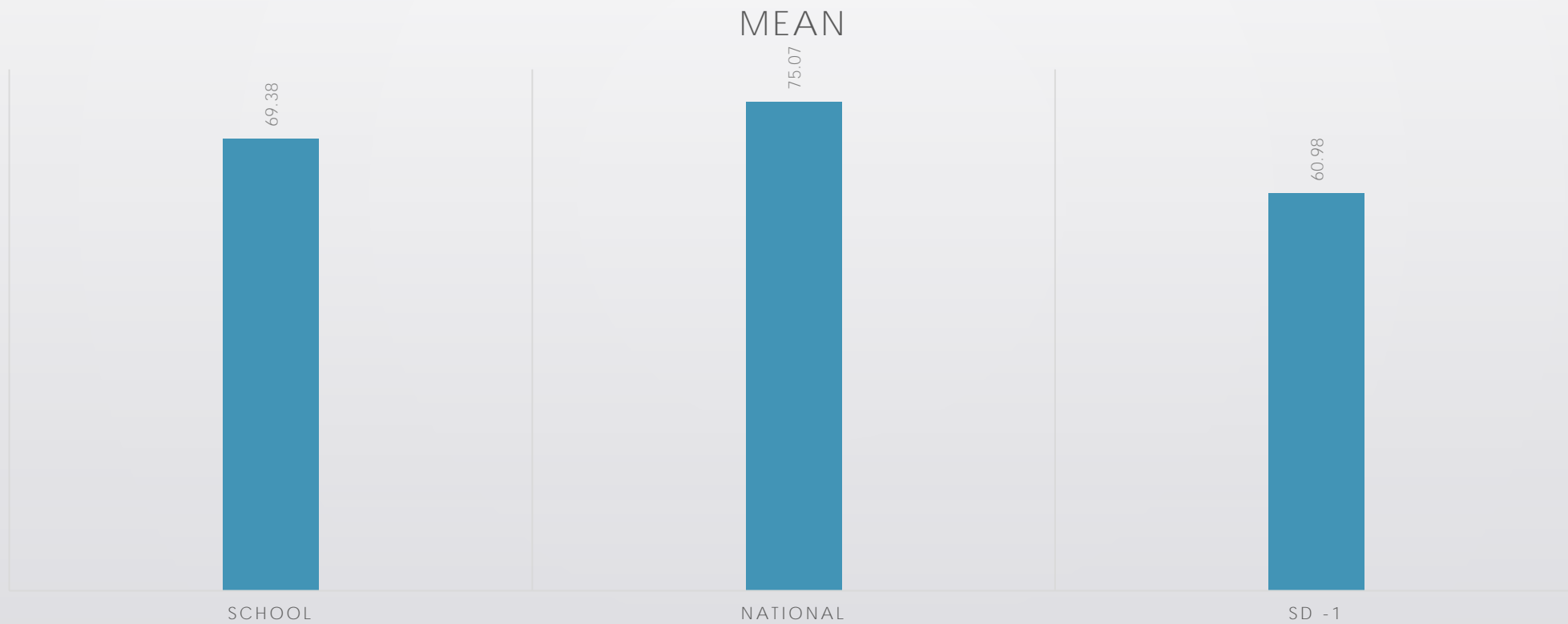
CECE COUNSELING PROGRAM SCORES COMPARED TO NATIONAL MEAN BY DOMAIN

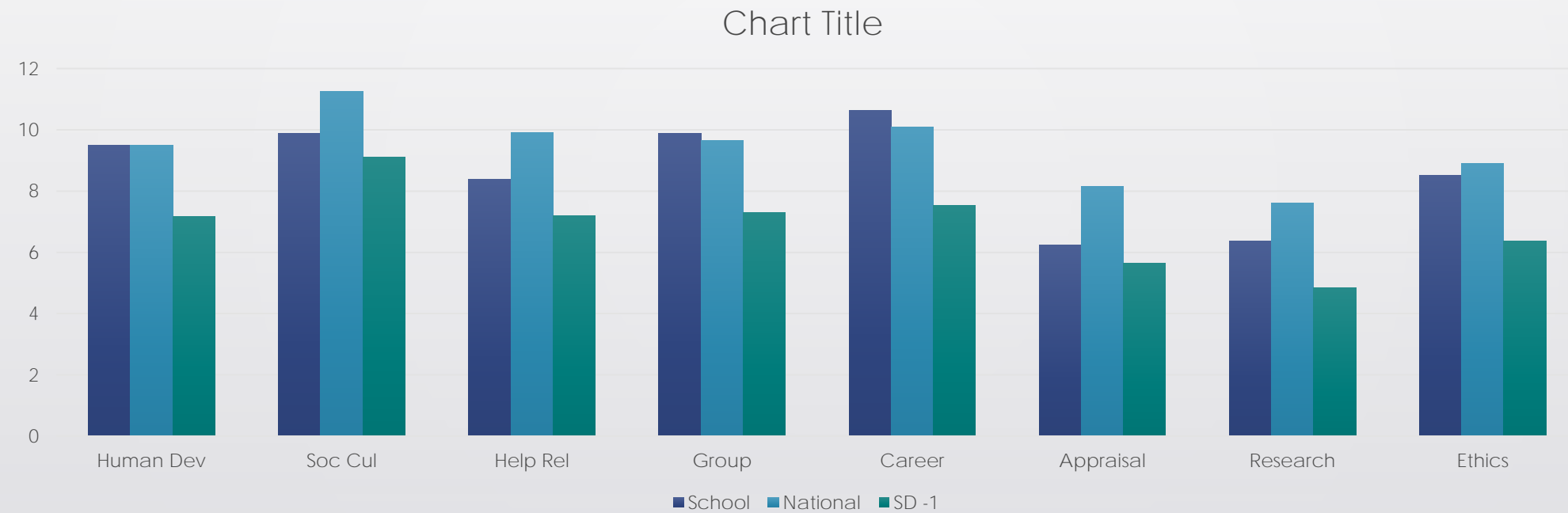




CECE Scores School Counseling Program



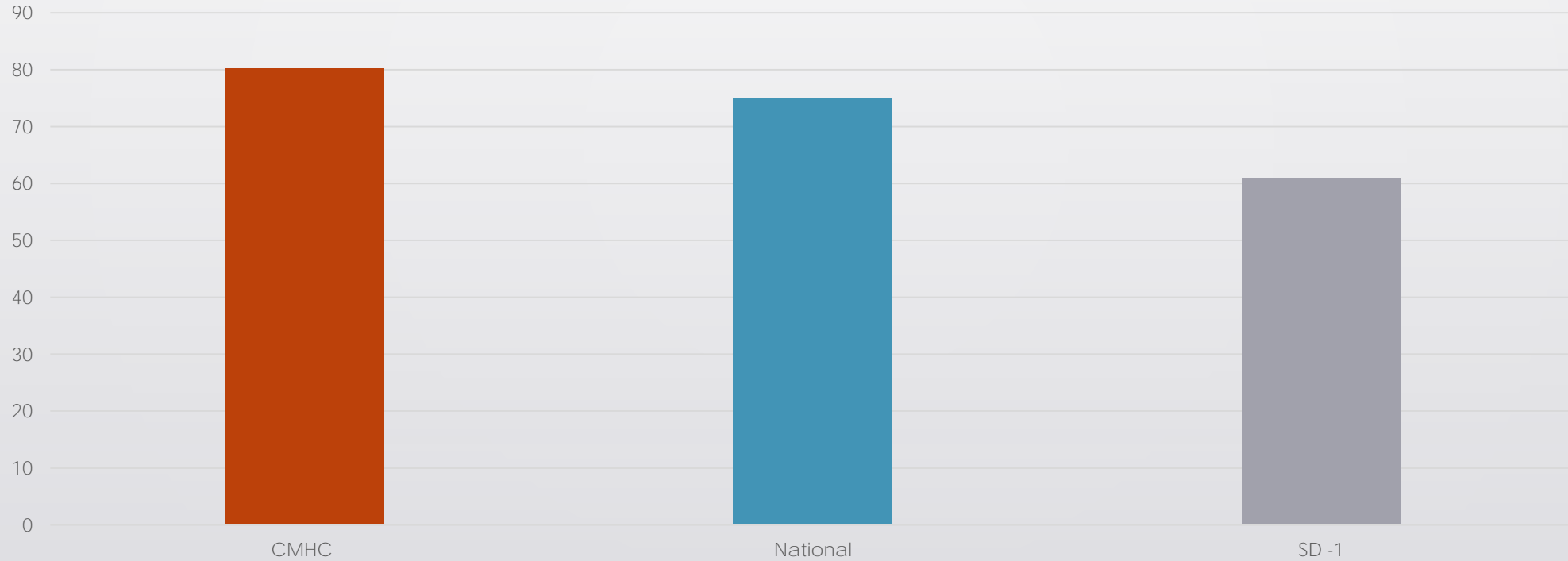
CECE SCORES BY DOMAIN SCHOOL COUNSELING PROGRAM



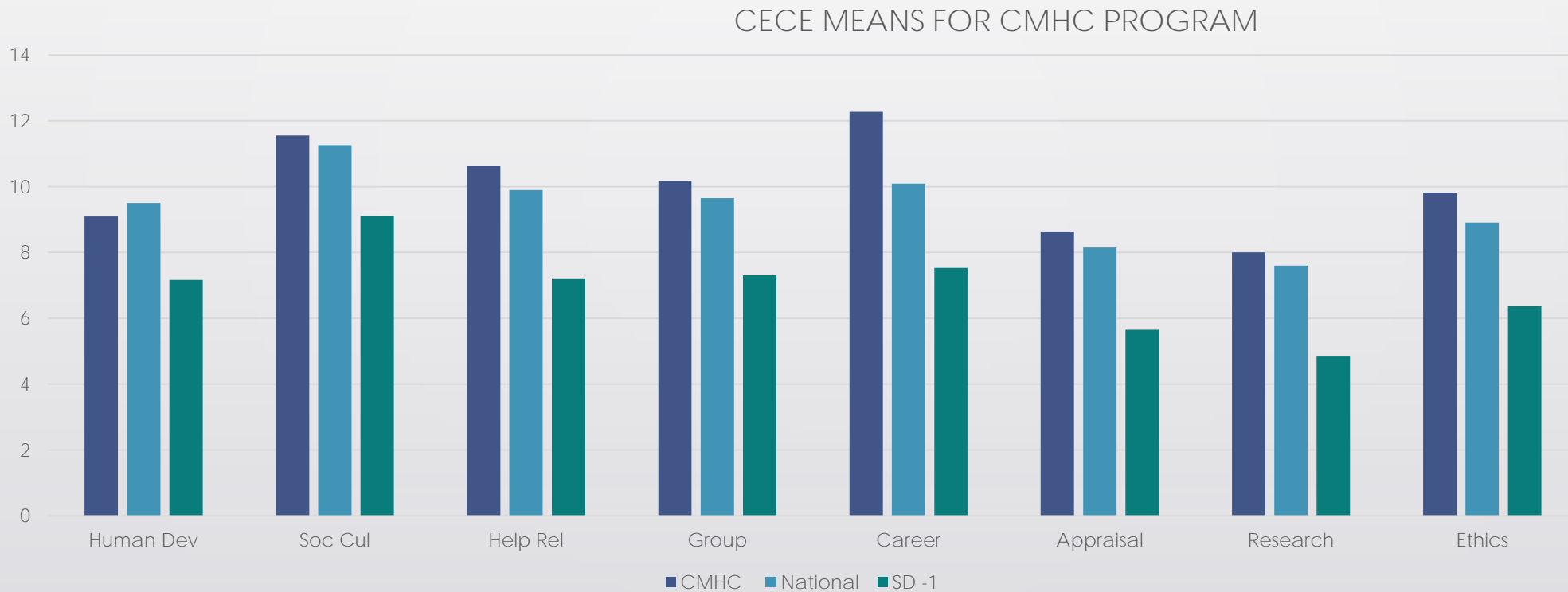


CECE MEANS CLINICAL MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELING PROGRAM
