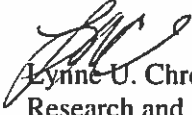

For FY 2016, the University received a total of \$64,045,402 in externally sponsored awards. The *Annual Report for FY 2016* is produced by the Office of Research and Economic Development and details externally funded research activity, clinical trials activity, and intellectual property activity. A report detailing expenditures is provided by the Division of Finance and Administration.

Highlights of the *Annual Report for FY 2016* include the following:

- The College of Allied Health Professions and the Mitchell Cancer Institute increased the number of proposals submitted, the number of external awards received and the total amount of externally funded awards received over those same numbers tallied in FY 2015.
- In FY 2016, twelve (12) of 17 reporting units increased the number of proposals submitted to external agencies for funding consideration over FY 2015 submissions.
- Research awards totaled 43% of the funds received in FY 2016.
- The Colleges of Education and Business, the Mitchell Cancer Institute, the University Library, and the University Hospitals and Clinics recorded an increase in external funding over FY 2014.
- This year's annual awards include \$20,999,268 in Pell grants.
- Expenditures in FY 2016 totaled \$36,807,372. The report includes two sections: Expenditures by Division, and Expenditures by Source.
- Clinical trials activity, as reported by the South Alabama Medical Science Foundation, includes 64 awards totaling \$1,513,192. This amount is reflected in the College of Medicine dollars awarded.

Gross licensing revenues received during FY 2016 are reported by the Office of Intellectual Property Management, and total \$1,937,947. The larger portion of this revenue was attributable to license agreement between the South Alabama Medical Science Foundation and a subsidiary of Merck KGaA. Other key statistics include twenty-five (25) invention disclosures submitted, sixteen (16) U.S. patents filed, seven (7) U.S. patents issued, and one (1) license/option agreement executed.

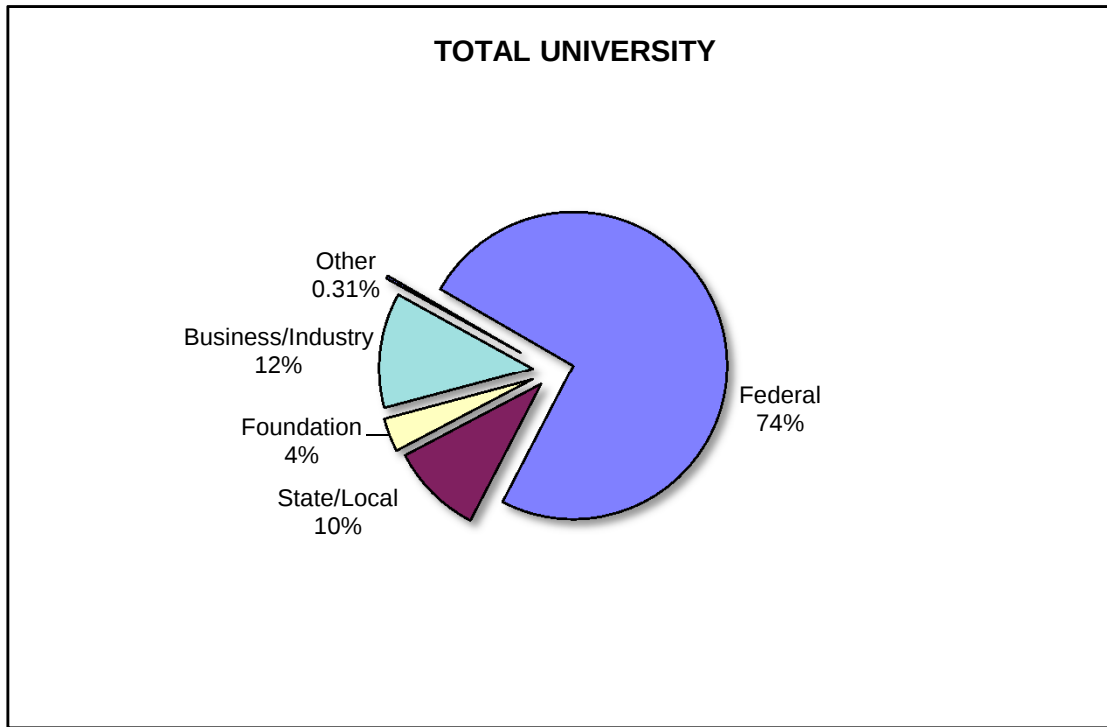

DISTRIBUTION OF SPONSORED FUNDING

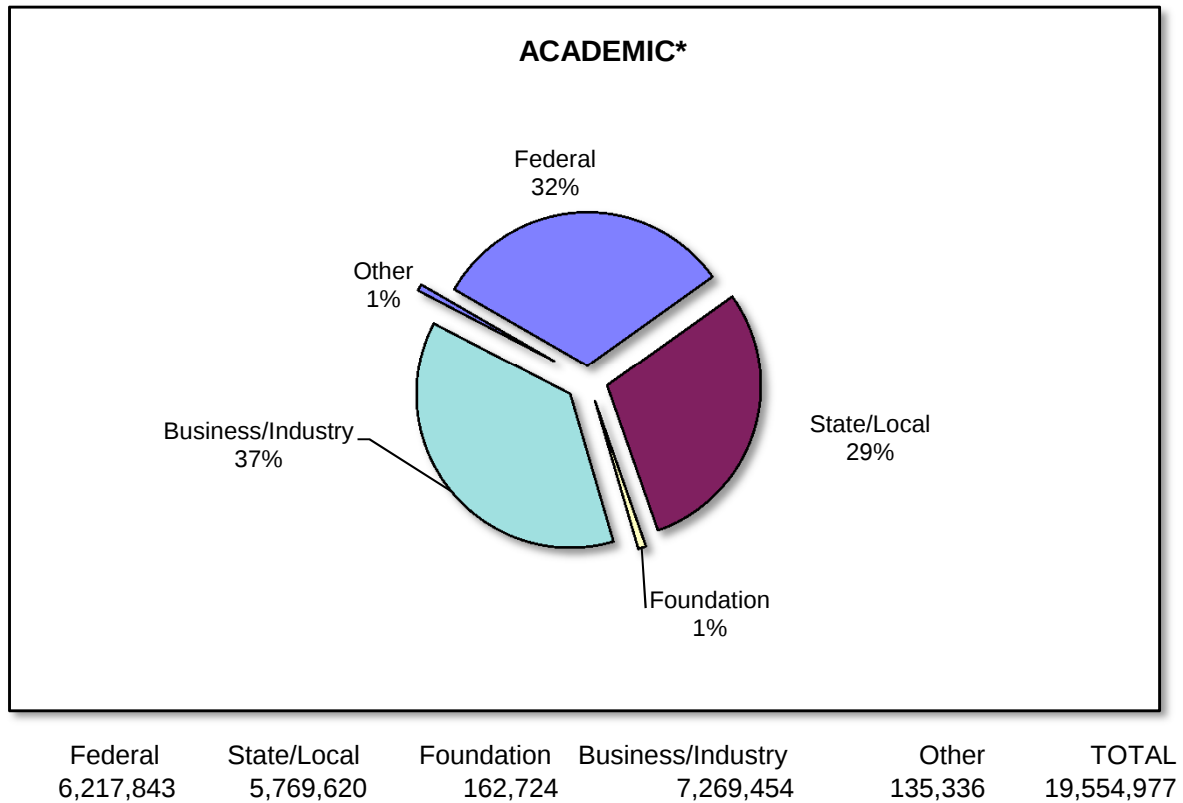
BY FUNDING SOURCE FISCAL YEAR 2016

DISTRIBUTION OF SPONSORED FUNDING

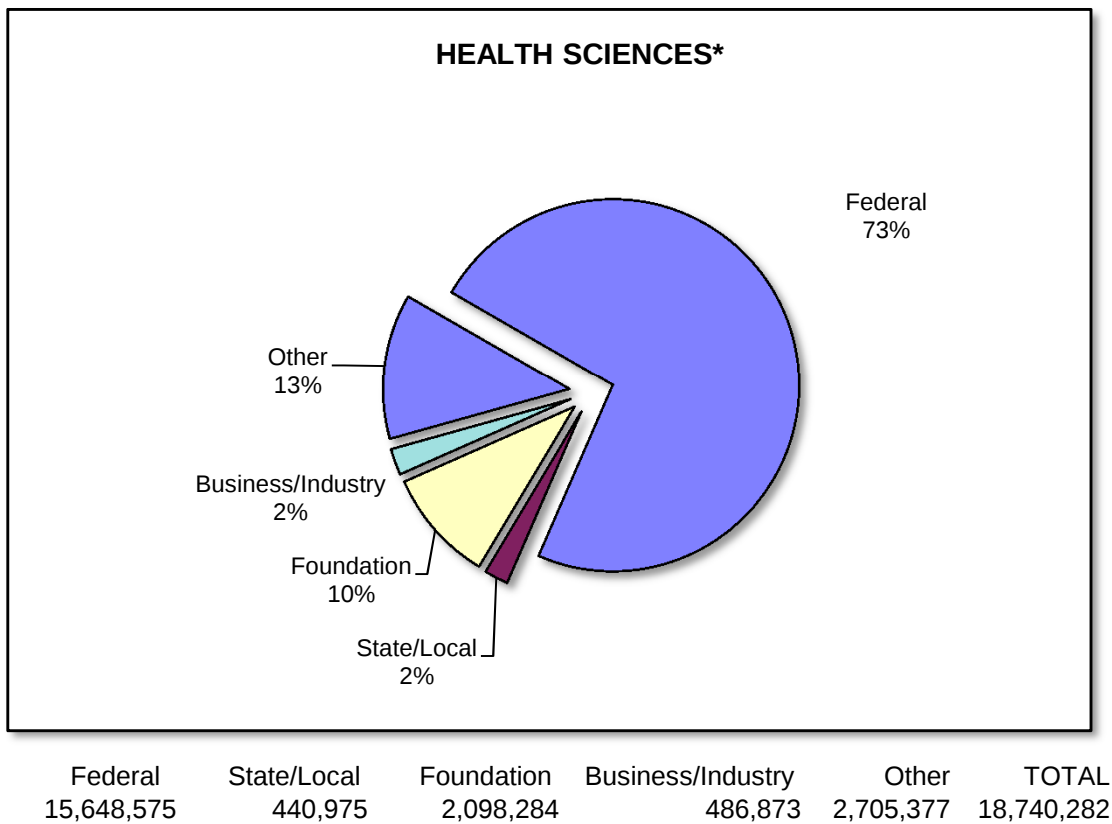
BY FUNDING SOURCE FISCAL YEAR 2016

DISTRIBUTION OF SPONSORED FUNDING

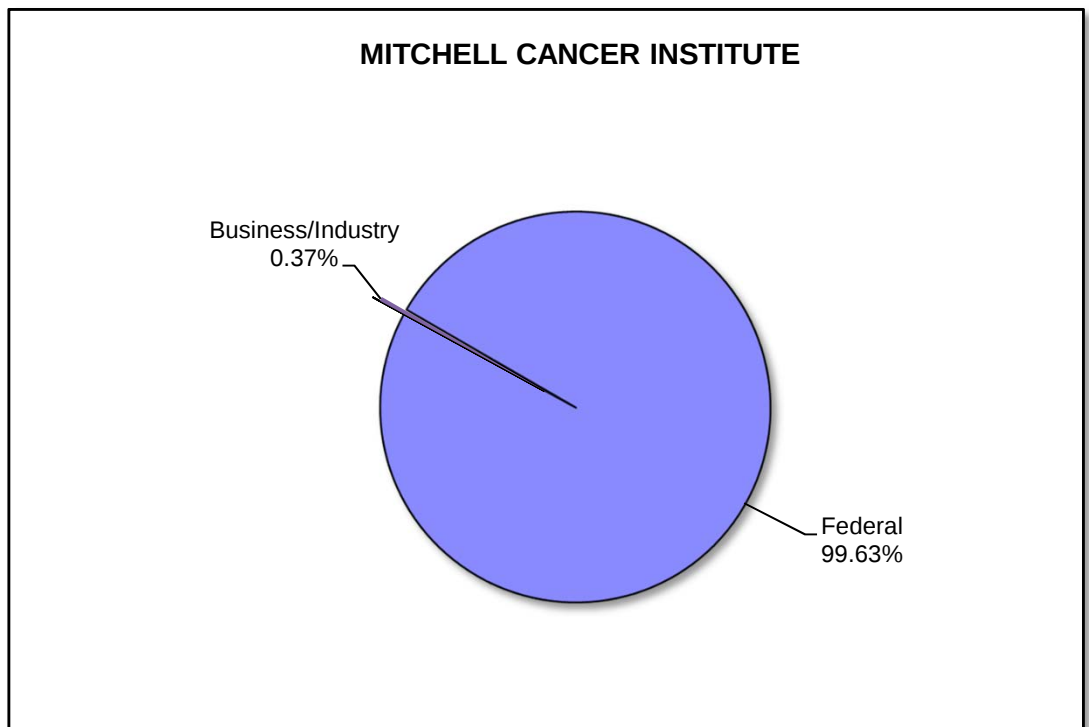
BY FUNDING SOURCE FISCAL YEAR 2016

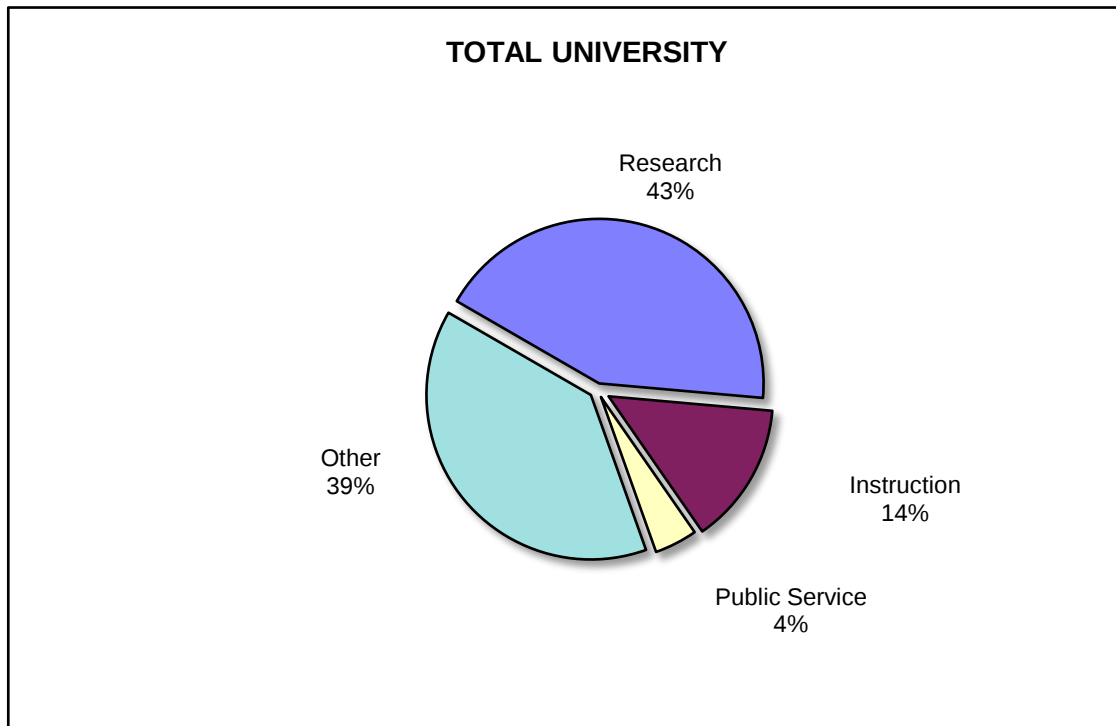

DISTRIBUTION OF AWARDS

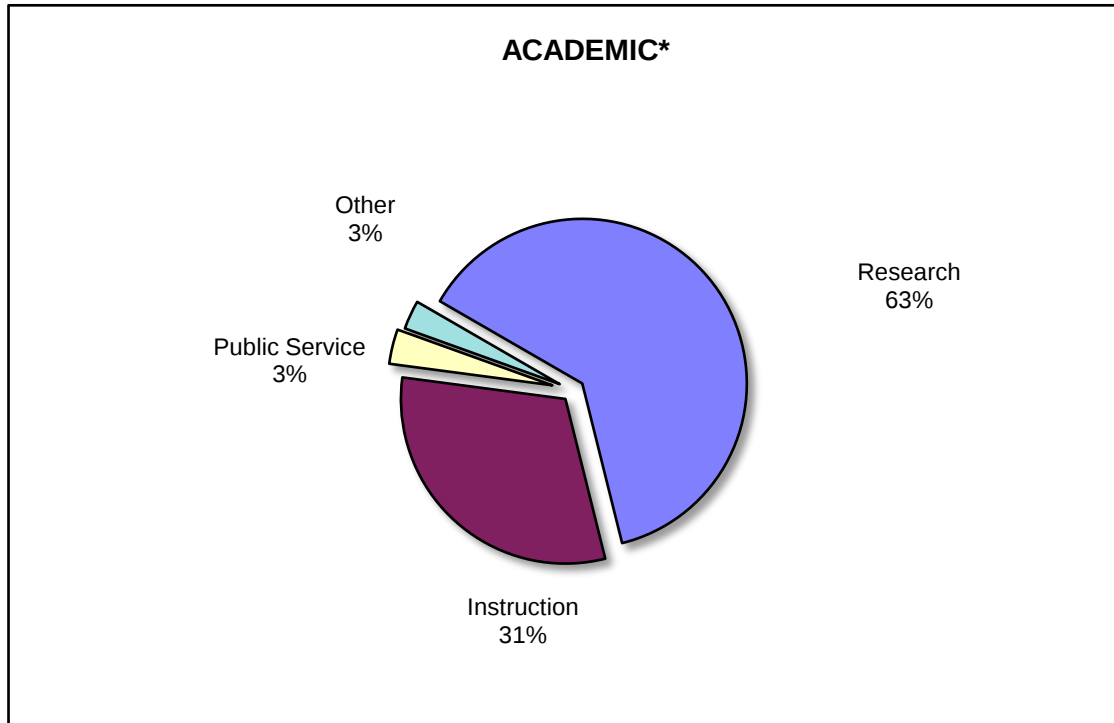
BY FUNDING PURPOSE FISCAL YEAR 2016

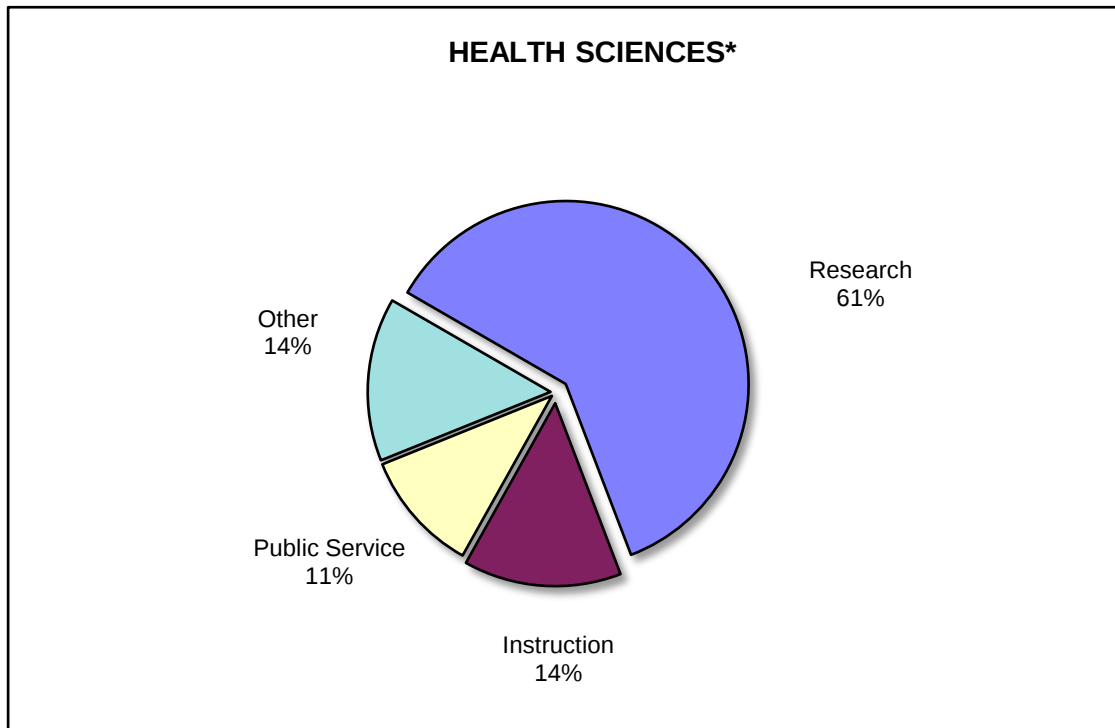

BY FUNDING PURPOSE FISCAL YEAR 2016

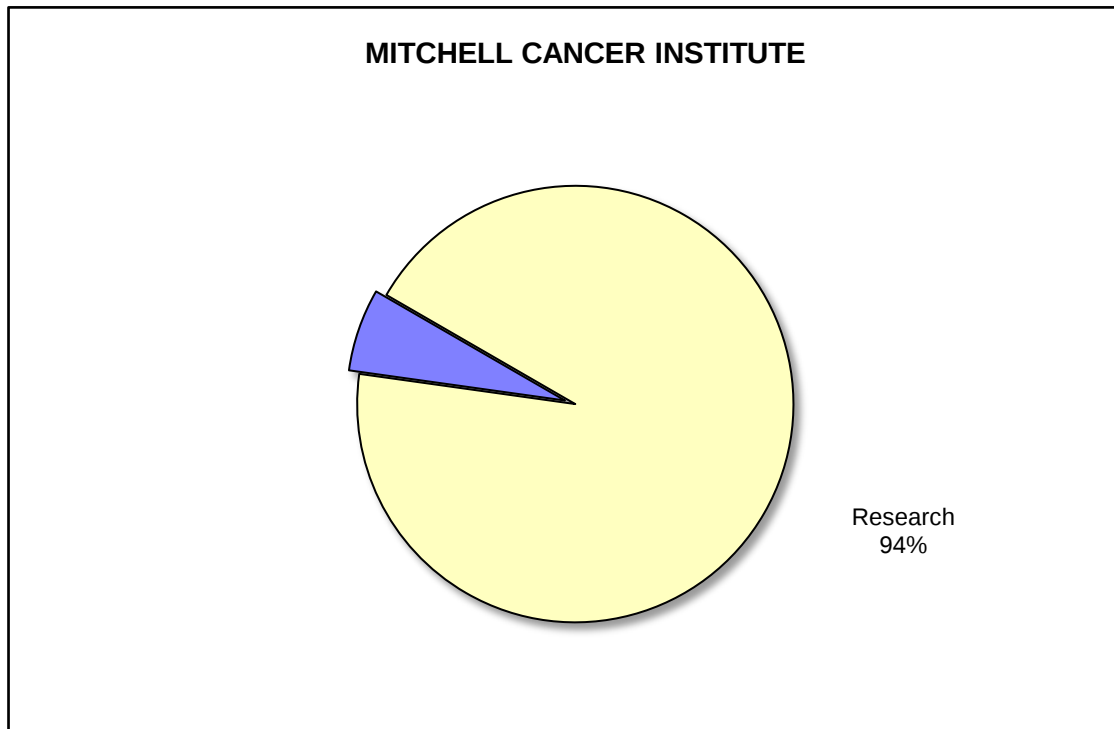

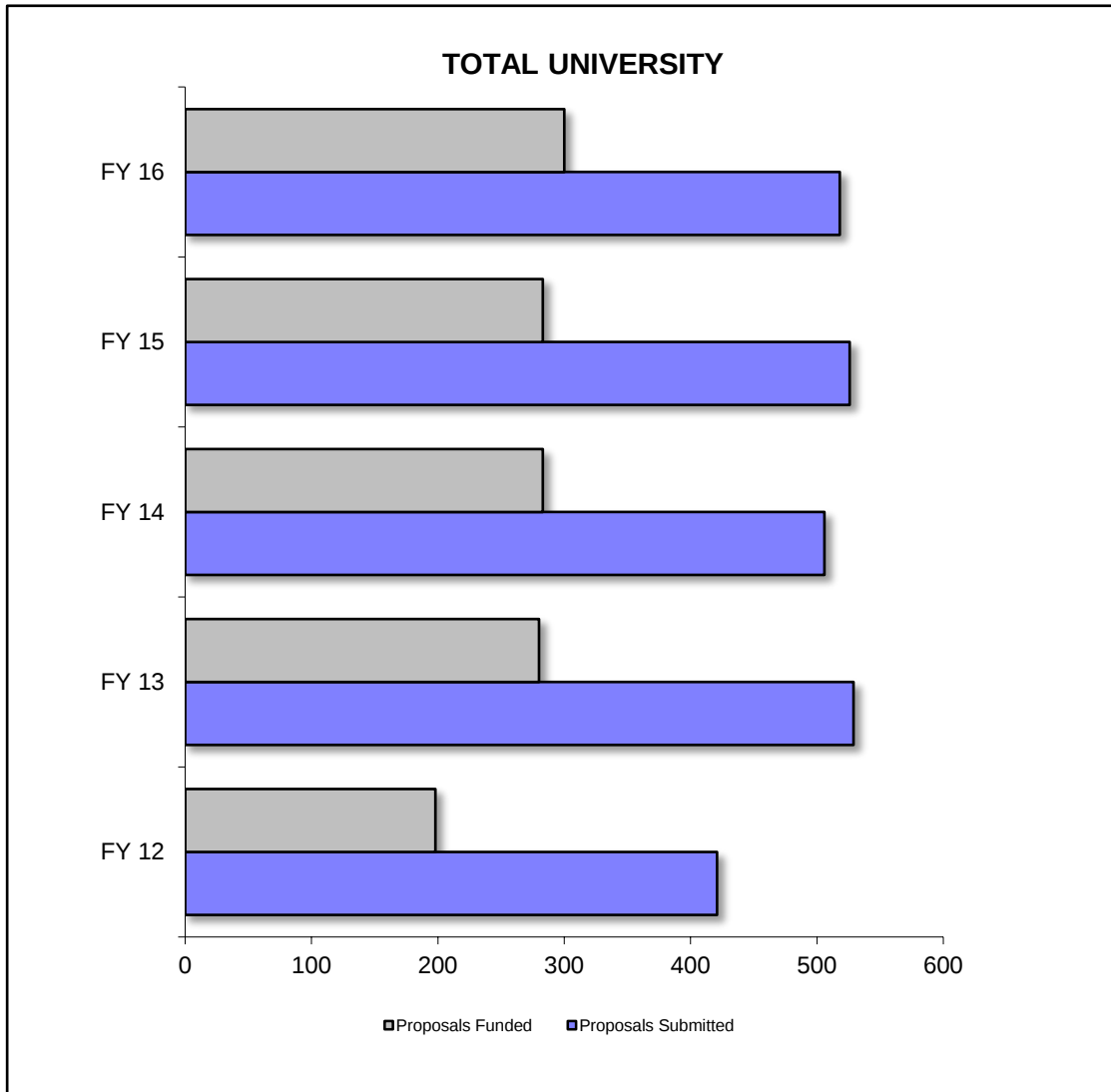

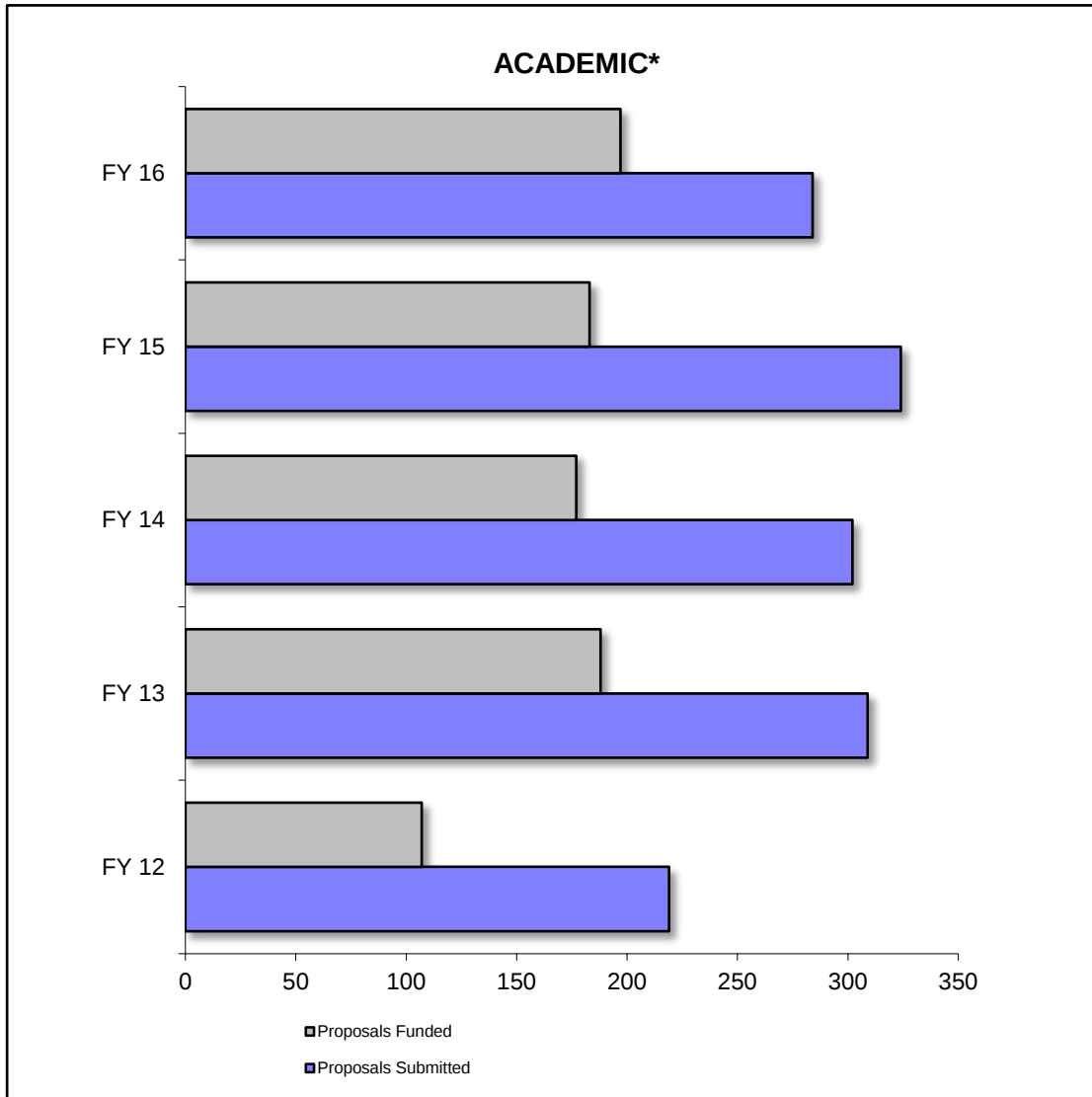
BY UNIVERSITY TOTAL FY 12 - FY 16

BY ACADEMIC FY 12 - FY 16

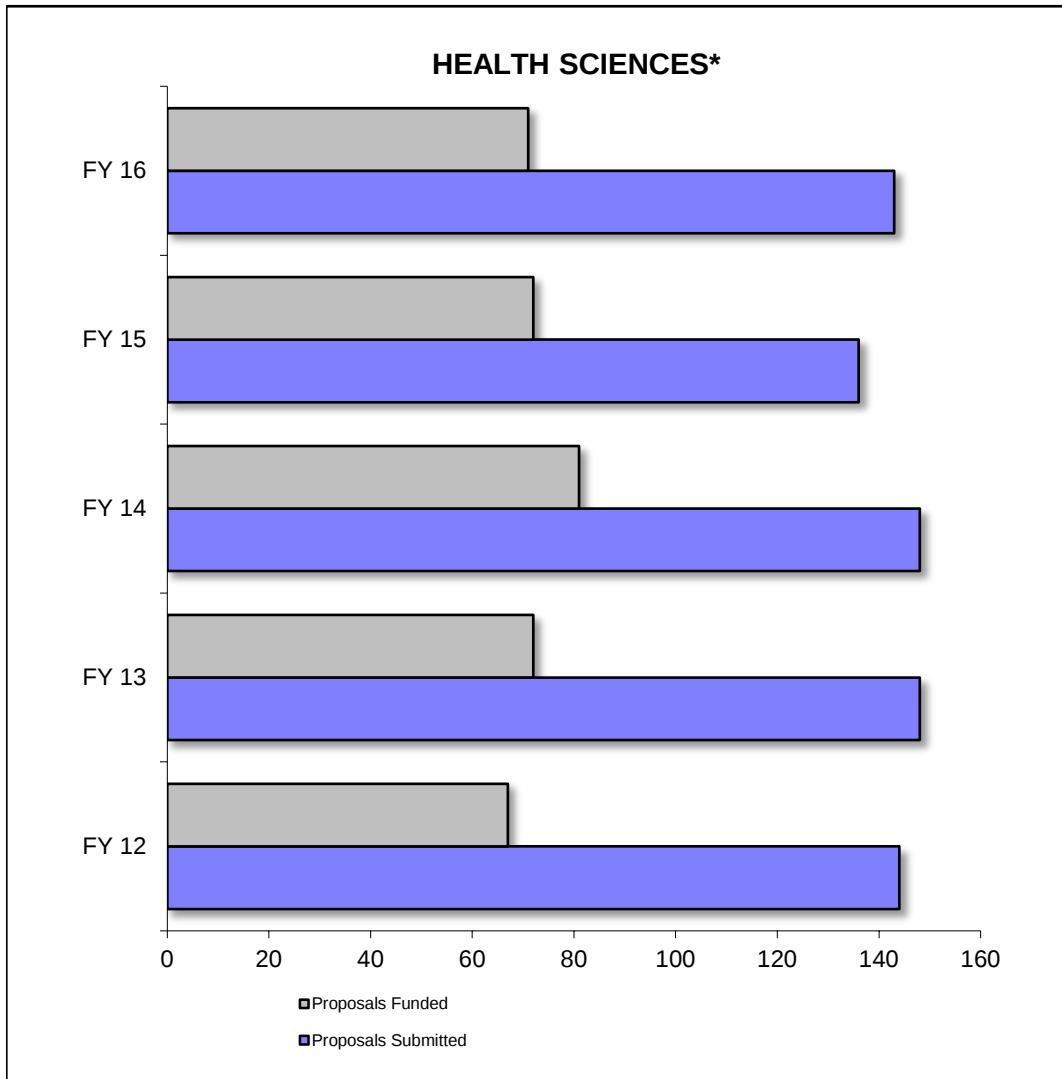

HEALTH SCIENCES FY 12 - FY 16

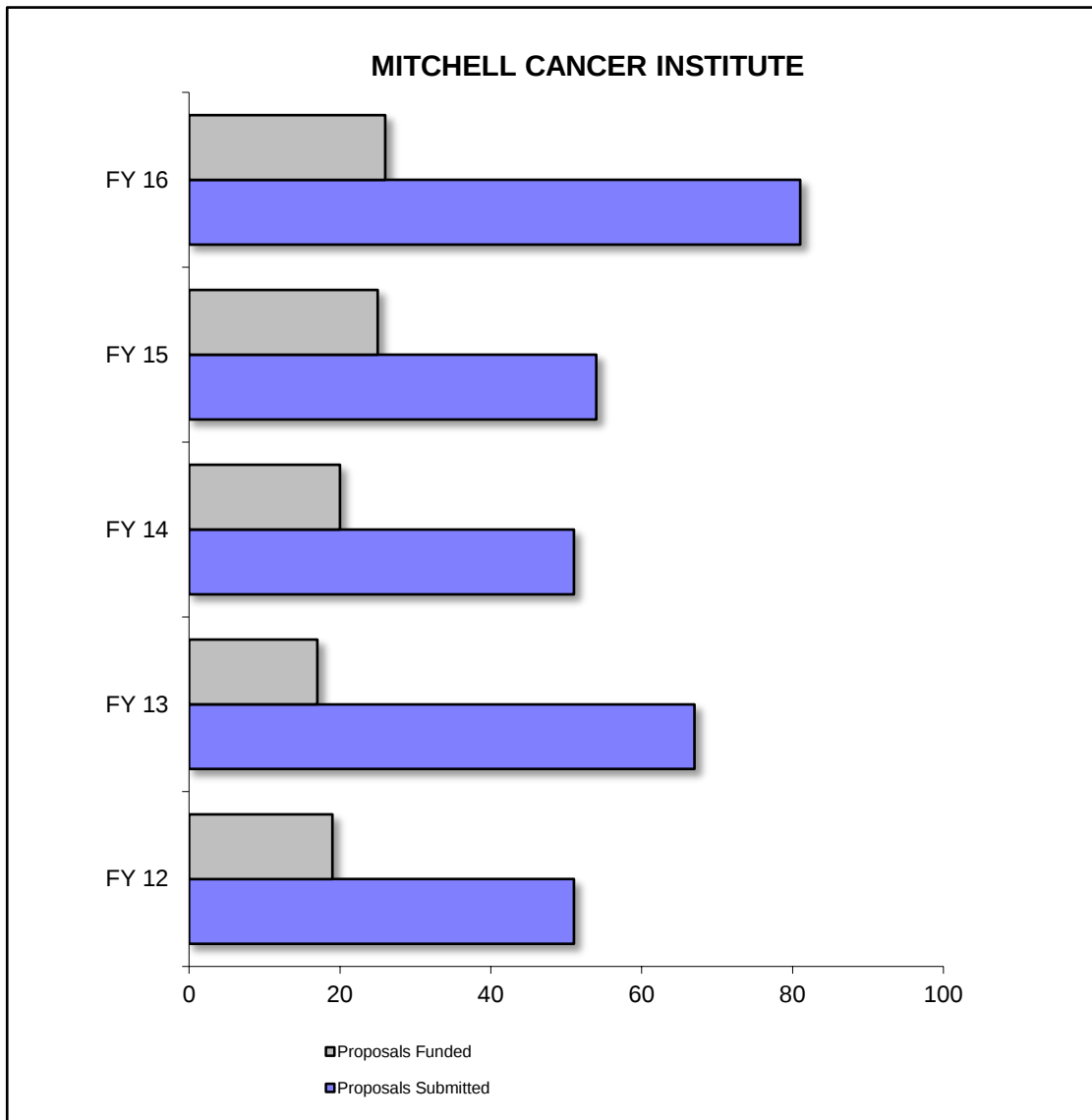
